





PHILOPTOCHOS MISSION STATEMENT

The Greek Orthodox Ladies Philoptochos Society, Inc., is the duly accredited women's philanthropic society of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. The mission of the society shall be:

To help the poor, the destitute, the hungry, the aged, the sick, the unemployed, the orphaned, the imprisoned, the widowed, the handicapped, the victims of disasters, to undertake the burial of impoverished persons and to offer assistance to anyone who may need the help of the Church through fundraising efforts; and

To promote the charitable, benevolent, and philanthropic purposes of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, through instructional programs, presentations, lectures, seminars, and other educational resources:

To preserve and perpetuate Orthodox Christian concepts and the Orthodox Christian Family, and through them, to promote the Greek Orthod ox Faith and traditions, in accordance with its doctrines, canons, discipline, divine worship, usage, and customs;

To promote participation in the activities of the Greek Orthodox community, with the cooperation of the Parish Priest and the Parish Council.

The charitable work of the Society shall be performed with discretion, courtesy, and kindness.

HISTORY OF PHILOPTOCHOS **CMF LUNCHEON**

The Children's Medical Fund Luncheon was first introduced as the Cancer Fund Luncheon in 1989 at the Waldorf Astoria in New York City, followed by a second event in 1990. Proceeds from these early gatherings supported Memorial Sloan Kettering Hospital, the Greek Children's Cancer Fund, and the Kids-n-Cancer Program.

Recognizing the impact and the potential of this initiative, Philoptochos officially named it the Children's Medical Fund Luncheon in 1991. With this new identity came an expanded mission: to assist young cancer patients, provide grants for pediatric hospitals nationwide, and to organizations that care for children with critical and life-threatening illnesses.

In 1993, under National President Dina Skouras Oldknow, it was decided that the luncheon should rotate among major cities throughout the Archdiocese. The first city outside New York to host was Buckhead, Georgia, in the Metropolis of Atlanta. This historic decision opened the door for Philoptochos Chapters across the country to take an active role in shaping the event, while also allowing the National President and Board to connect with local chapters and communities on a more personal level. The luncheon quickly became not only a fundraiser, but also a unifying force across the Archdiocese.

Since then, Philoptochos has hosted nineteen Children's Medical Fund Luncheons biennially, rotating among the Archdiocesan District and the eight Metropolises of the Archdiocese. Each luncheon is a moving and memorable experience, featuring distinguished pediatric physicians, dedicated nonprofit leaders, courageous parents, and, most inspiring of all, children who bravely share their stories. These gatherings bring together tears and triumph, compassion and joy, leaving every attendee uplifted and deeply inspired.

Over the decades, the Children's Medical Fund Luncheon has distributed millions of dollars in grants, thanks to the generosity of sponsors, donors, and chapters nationwide. These funds have advanced innovative pediatric research, strengthened hospitals, and provided comfort and care to countless children and families in need.

This year marks the 20th Anniversary of the Children's Medical Fund Luncheon, a milestone celebrating its remarkable history and enduring mission of love, hope, and healing.

The Children's Medical Fund Luncheon is one of Philoptochos' most meaningful endeavors—a legacy of faith, compassion, and service that continues to change lives. Truly, it embodies the call: "Let us rejoice and embrace the children."
